Vampires – Fact or Fiction?

Everybody has heard stories about vampires. The word *vampire* is of Slavic origin, as the legend originated centuries ago in south-eastern Europe, in Transylvania and Serbia.

1. Since the inhabitants of Germany, France and England did not know much about these distant lands, they listened with fear and amazement to the strange tales told by merchants and travelers.

2. Many romantic authors in the early nineteenth century wrote novels about foggy mountains, terrifying creatures, distant castles and their mysterious inhabitants. In 1897, Bram Stoker wrote a book about Dracula, the most famous vampire of all time.

3. Stoker's tale was set in Transylvania, in Count Dracula's castle, and in nineteenth century London. However, Dracula was not a historical novel. It was a romance, a story about an unhappy vampire who fell in love with Mina, a beautiful girl who reminded Dracula of the wife he had lost years ago.

4. This film, by Francis Ford Coppola, with Gary Oldman and Winona Ryder, became a box office hit – it shows that every generation wants to discover vampires for themselves.

Barbara Cartland – Pretty in Pink

1. Barbara Cartland, the world's best selling writer and Queen of Romance, died at the age of 98 in May 2000. Writing an average of twenty-three novels a year, she completed over 700 books, which have been translated into major languages, including Japanese, Chinese and Russian. Her literary career started in 1923 and she sold over 900 million copies of her books worldwide.

2. Even in her late nineties, Barbara Cartland was full of the energy of a much younger woman. Although she could not see or hear very well, she listened carefully and talked with enthusiasm about English society and its values. She said, 'What we have to do is bring back the wonderful manners English gentleman used to have. All over the world, when I was a little girl, they all thought the English had beautiful manners and behaved extremely well'.

3. Barbara Cartland respected the ideals of charity and kindness. 'it's very important to think about new ideas for helping people', she said. 'Nobody bothers today. People are not helping each other the way they used to. We must get away from that.' She supported a number of British charities.

4. Cartland was also famous for playing an active role in politics. She managed to get government support for programmes to provide houses for elderly people. She was even responsible for a change in the law which forced local government to provide sites for gypsy communities and enable gypsy children to attend local schools.

5. She met politicians, royalty and stars from all over the world, but meeting the rich and famous was not the most important thing in Barbara Cartland's life. Instead, she said, 'the great thing is really to feel that you're helping other people'. She wanted to be remembered for her books through which she tried to give morality, beauty and love to the world.
